# WELCOME

---

If you have made it this far, it means you have carefully read the information about the **Missions School** and would like to better understand how the experience works in practice.

This guide was created to **set clear expectations**, explain practical details, and **help you evaluate**, with clarity and responsibility, whether this is the right time for you to participate in the Missions School. We strongly recommend reading this document in full before completing your application.

## General context

The Missions School is a **12-week, full-time program**, held at the BKK Missions Base in Teresina, in the state of Piauí, Brazil.

## The program includes:

- Theoretical teaching
- Practical activities
- Community life
- A structured daily routine

This is **not** a tourist experience, a traditional academic course, or a part-time program.

It is an immersive training experience that requires full availability and commitment.

# WHY WAS THIS SCHOOL CREATED?

---

In **1982**, when Reinhard was 21 years old, he received a prophecy that God would build, through his life, a base to reach the nations.


Over the years, this word has been confirmed step by step.

The Missions School was born as part of this journey—not to form people merely in biblical knowledge, but to lead them into a deep, real, and lived relationship with the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

We believe this relationship does not end in itself. It produces an overflow—expressed through love, service, and mission among the nations.

For this reason, the Missions School exists to teach how to live the Gospel in practice, the way Jesus taught us—not in a religious or institutional way, but grounded in the truth of the Word.

We believe this project was born in the heart of God, with the purpose of spreading His message among the nations.



# LOCATION, CLIMATE, AND ENVIRONMENT

---

The **BKK Missions Base** is located outside the urban center of Teresina.

## Climate

**Teresina** is known for its hot climate throughout most of the year, with daytime temperatures frequently reaching 33–35°C (91–95°F), especially during the second half of the year.

The facilities are simple and functional, aligned with the purpose of the program.

Applicants should be aware of and comfortable with living in a hot and simple environment for the entire duration of the Missions School.

## Mission Base Structure

The base was designed to support:

- Focus
- Community life
- Practical mission work

It does **not** follow a tourist or hotel-style accommodation standard.

# ACCOMMODATION

---

- Shared rooms, with up to four students per room
- Divided by gender: men's wing and women's wing
- Each room has a fan
- No air conditioning is available in the rooms

## Bathrooms

- Shared bathrooms, separated by gender
- Located within the men's and women's wings

Living together in shared rooms and common areas is an essential part of the Missions School experience.



# MEALS

---

- 🌀 From Monday to Saturday, lunch is prepared by a cook and served to students
- 🌀 For breakfast and dinner, the base provides the necessary food items
- 🌀 Students are responsible for preparing their own breakfast and dinner

**Important:** The Missions School is not able to accommodate specific dietary restrictions, including special diets, allergies, or food preferences.

## COMMUNITY LIFE AND MAINTENANCE ROUTINE

The Missions Base operates within a community life model. During the program, students participate in a maintenance routine, which may include:

- Cleaning common areas
- Organizing shared spaces
- Supporting daily base tasks

**These activities are part of the Missions School proposal and contribute to the development of responsibility, humility, and healthy community living.**

# PROGRAM RHYTHM AND ROUTINE

---

The Missions School runs from **Monday** to **Saturday**, with activities scheduled throughout the day.

Full availability is expected from all students.

## PRACTICAL ACTIVITIES

During the Missions School, each student will be assigned to two main areas or projects, where they will serve more consistently throughout their stay.

**These fixed areas are designed to:**

- Encourage responsibility and continuity
- Allow deeper involvement
- Facilitate organization and follow-up

Areas and projects are assigned by the coordination team based on:

- Base and project needs
- The student's profile
- The dynamics of each term

# PRACTICAL ACTIVITIES

---

Although each student has primary areas of responsibility, participation is not limited to those areas.

## Students may also:

- 🌀 Support other projects
- 🌀 Participate in specific actions
- 🌀 Help with events and special activities

The distribution of activities may change depending on the week, project demand, and school organization.

In addition to classes and practical activities, the Missions School includes:

- 🌀 Daily devotional times
- 🌀 Moments of prayer
- 🌀 Worship and community gatherings

## LANGUAGE

To participate in the Missions School, students must be fluent in at least one of the following languages:

PORTUGUESE

ENGLISH

Daily communication will be mixed, using both languages.

As the program takes place in Brazil, Portuguese will be the most commonly used language in daily life.

# LANGUAGE

---

## Language support

For students who do not speak the local language, the Missions School offers:

Basic language classes focused on daily communication

English classes for Portuguese speakers

Portuguese classes for English speakers

Translator support during classes and key program moments

**These classes are introductory and practical, intended to support communication and integration—not language fluency.**

# TRANSPORT

Transportation to and from the base is limited and organized according to:

The school schedule

Practical activities

Coordination guidelines

The Missions School does not provide free or individual transportation for personal use.

**Any time away from the base must respect the established schedule and coordination guidelines.**

# ARRIVAL AND AIRPORT TRANSFER

---

The Missions School cannot accommodate students before the official program start date.

Students arriving from outside Brazil must:

- Be aware of the number of days they are legally allowed to stay in the country
- Arrange their own accommodation (such as a hotel) if arriving early

Airport pickup

- Airport pickup will be provided
- Pickup details will be communicated after application approval
- Arrival instructions will be sent closer to the program start date

Students are advised not to purchase flights before receiving official guidance from the Missions School.



# FREE TIME AND LEAVING THE BASE

---

- Sundays are free, unless a special project or activity is scheduled and previously communicated
- During free time, students are free to organize their own activities

## Important guidelines

- Students are responsible for their **own transportation** during free time
- The Missions School does **not provide transportation** for personal activities
- **Overnight stays outside the base are not permitted** during the program

All students must respect the schedules and guidelines set by the coordination team.



# HEALTH AND PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY

---

**Each student is responsible for:**

- Health or travel insurance (if desired)
- Personal medications
- Basic health care needs

**The Missions School does not provide medical services on site.**

## INFORMATION FOR FOREIGNERS – VISA AND STAY IN BRAZIL

Visa requirements depend on nationality and the regulations in effect at the time of travel.

- Some nationalities may enter Brazil as tourists for up to 90 days, with the possibility of extension
- Other nationalities require a visa in advance

**Important:**

- Visa verification is the sole responsibility of the student
- The Missions School does not assist with visas
- Students must present:
  - A valid travel document
  - A visa, when required
  - A return ticket

We strongly recommend consulting official government sources or a Brazilian consulate before applying.

# INVESTMENT, PAYMENT METHODS, AND DEADLINES

---

The participation fee covers the basic costs of the Missions School, including:

- Accommodation at the Missions Base
- Lunch from Monday to Saturday, and food to make breakfast and dinner
- Theoretical teaching and guidance
- Practical activities and community life
- Basic educational materials

## Cost

The investment consists of an **application fee** and the **total course fee**.

**Application fee:**

**R\$ 300,00 / € 100,00**

The application fee is **non-refundable** if the applicant is not approved.

If approved, the fee is **deducted from the total course cost**.

**INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS**

*€ 2.400*

## Payment methods

Payment methods will be communicated after pre-application and approval, and may include:

- Bank transfer
- Pix (Brazil residents)
- International payment (international students)

Detailed instructions will be sent by email after **application review**.

## Deadlines and enrollment confirmation

- Applications must be submitted up to 120 days before the start of the selected term
- Full payment must be completed up to 60 days before the start of classes

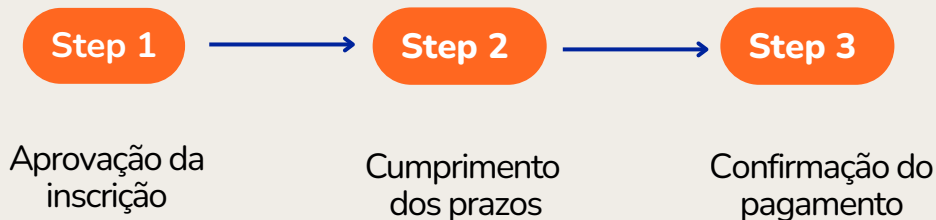
Enrollment is only confirmed after payment confirmation.

November 2 - Applications close 6 months before the start of each term

December 2 - Applicants will receive a response

January 2 - 50% payment deadline

February 2 - Final payment deadline
